



## Make a Change

DSG Behavior Intervention pilot program provides up to six free sessions with a Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) to members in need.

DSG recognizes that our members may face many challenges as they seek to provide the best supports and resources for their loved ones with Down syndrome. Often times behavior challenges and needs extend beyond the experience and talents of families. Our goal is to offer programs and services to help address behavior concerns immediately for a family so they can enjoy life and advocate effectively for their child's needs.

Thanks to a generous grant, DSG is piloting a program where our members can access up to six behavior sessions with a Board Certified Behavior Analyst. The BCBA will provide assessment and intervention strategies to help address behavior challenges in a supportive, caring and confidential environment.



### HOME ASSESSMENT & INTAKE FORM

Families will complete an intake form and participate in a home assessment to observe, analyze and address behavior concerns.



### DEVELOP AN ACTION PLAN

Information gathered will be analyzed into a behavior intervention plan to support needs in home and community settings.



### IMPLEMENTATION & MONITORING

Families will implement the behavior plan at home and in the community, monitor for improvement and changes, communicate with BCBA and adjust as necessary over six sessions.
